Their first novel, Catch & Release, will be published by Guernica Editions.



Maria Pia Spadafora is a freelance translator, creative writer, a teacher of Italian, English and Spanish. She holds an MA in Modern Languages and Literature, presenting as a final dissertation the translation of Licia Canton's The Pink House and Other Stories. In April 2020, she translated from Spanish to Italian the story of the short film nominated for Premio Goya 2020, Laura Zamora's El árbol de las almas perdidas. She lives and works in Milan.
